I host a Campus Life Outreach once a week at a local high school. In the last couple of years, I have had several youth open up and share that they cut their arms and legs. They are not trying to commit suicide but rather get a release from the emotional pain that plagues them. Some feel they have no control over their lives and it is the one thing they can control. Lately, movies and TV shows have drawn attention to cutting. It has provoked tweens and teens who have never cut themselves to try it. Our message is that Jesus shed his blood on the cross to heal their emotional pain so that they wouldn't have to practice this act to try and alleviate their pain. Jesus came to heal the broken hearted and set liberty to those who are bound. In January, one youth proclaimed that she has chosen not to cut anymore. Please continue to pray that God will totally set youth in our community free from this practice and that they will fully understand His heart of healing for them.
