We have been keeping up with as many youth as possible due to the corona virus quarantine, but we are still able to contact them through Facebook and using Zoom.

We started doing our "Verge" youth group via Zoom and it was so good to see the youth and to do a short Bible study with them. It must be a difficult time for a lot of our youth, because many of them have never gone through a time like this. Many of them do not come from a Christian home and are not able to lean on God and His love during this difficult time.

Our Campus Life Outreach leaders are also staying in touch with some of the youth that came to the Bible studies in the high schools and middle schools including NCHS, Kelly Walsh, Roosevelt, Cy middle school and Centennial middle school. We are looking forward to being able to be back in the schools and ministering to all the youth when the schools are open once again.

One of our youth who we made contact with a few years ago and came to the Link quite often has unfortunately been sentenced to prison in Rawlins. He was in the Natrona County jail for a few weeks and we were able to visit him and keep in contact through letters. I received a letter from him from prison and he was telling me that he had become part of a Bible study there and is hoping with the help of God to once again get his life back on track. He desires to once again have God lead him. He shared how all of us here at Youth for Christ helped him navigate some difficult seasons in his teen years and how it's reassuring to him to know that we are still here to encourage him while he is in prison.

Due to the mandatory requirement of the Coronavirus pandemic, in our communication with youth, we are limited to online technology and text messaging.

Many of the youth we spoke with shared how bored they were and really missed our Campus Life Outreach and our Lunch at the Link Program. However, the story that truly broke our hearts was about a young man who not only faced the challenge of the pandemic but shared that his mom went "ghost" on them. In other words, she abandoned her children. She was not responding to any of their calls. As a result, the three teen siblings couldn't afford the expenses and all went their separate ways. This young man stated that he hasn't been able to locate his younger brother and still hasn't heard from his mother. Imagine facing this challenge with everything else going on. I let him know we are praying for his family. This young man now lives in another state. We will continue to maintain contact with him. Please remember this young man and his family in your prayers.

We will continue to maintain contact with youth through social media and other online outlets until we are able to meet with youth face-to-face again. In Christ, Sharon Lockwood
